**IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board will reconvene at the conclusion of the closed session and formal board action, if any, to be taken concerning matters discussed during the closed session will take place during the session open to the public.

**IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED** that to protect matters of privacy the minutes of the closed session shall be made available to the public at such time as the board deems it appropriate.
